

IMPACT OF PE & SPORTS PREMIUM FUNDING 2014-15

Introduction what is the Sports Premium?

The government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for the academic years 2013/14 and 2014/15 to provide new and substantial primary school sport funding. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. Each school will receive £8,000 plus an extra £5 per eligible pupil each year for the next two years. The money can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools. Purpose of the funding Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

PE & Sports Premium Funding 2014-15

PE & Sports Premium Funding 2014-15 is based on the total number of pupils on roll Years 1-6 (35 per pupil) in the Unity Federation Schools plus £8000 payment per school.

Each school spent their money separately and the following impact was measured:
